

The Virginia Ship Repair Foundation originated in 1979 when corporate officers of the individual private sector shipyards in South Hampton Roads jointly established a training facility named the Tidewater Maritime Training Institute (TMTI) to provide training for the ship repair industry in Hampton Roads. In 2006, TMTI changed its name to the Virginia Ship Repair Foundation (VSRF) and aligned its mission with the growing need to attract more qualified workers to the ship repair industry and improve incumbent worker qualifications. The VSRF, a 501(c)(3) educational non-profit organization, directly supports Virginia Ship Repair Association members.

With the help of dedicated industry volunteers, the Foundation directly reaches more than 10,000 students annually, provides recognition and support to Ship Repair workers, and raises more than \$50,000 each year to support programming.

Our Vision

The vision of the Virginia Ship Repair Foundation is to lead the ship repair workforce in Hampton Roads to recognition as the best qualified in the nation.

The Foundation's mission is to promote, support, and provide training, workforce development and resources to, and on behalf of, the ship repair industry.

Career & Industry Days

VSRF volunteers reach thousands of students each year, helping them understand the opportunities available in the Ship Repair Industry. These volunteers attend events in High Schools, Middle Schools, and Tech Schools, and promote the vast array of careers available in our industry. The Foundation also has more in-depth partnership with some schools, such as Norfolk Technical Center and the Academies of Hampton, to help students gain the skills they'll need for successful employment once they graduate.
