Relevant Experience

- Defended public utility connection fee ordinance for Virginia county prevailed by obtaining summary judgment at trial and having judgment affirmed by Virginia Supreme Court. Eagle Harbor LLC v. Isle of Wight County, 271 Va. 603, 628 S.E.2d 298 (2006).
